

Classroom Regulations and Grading Policy

Covid19- Online learning.

- We will be using Zoom to meet online. You are expected to have your video on during class.
 - Classes may be recorded. They will not be posted online.
 - If there is only one student during office hours, it will be recorded. Otherwise, it may or may not be.
- If we go back to school, I will give you the in school version.

Your responsibilities are:

To show respect to everyone in the class at all times. This includes, but is not limited to:

1. To yourself--to listen and learn mathematics. This entails coming to class prepared (notebook, paper, pencil(s), eraser etc.) and ready to be actively involved in your own learning.
2. To your neighbor. To not interfere with his/her ability to participate in the business of the class
3. To the class by not disrupting the class.

Deviations from the above responsibilities will result in your removal from the class period and/or commencement of discipline procedures in accordance with school policy.

Grading Policy

1. You will be graded on participation, classwork, which includes group work, HW, quizzes, tests
2. You may retake two tests each semester, one for a max score of 75% and the other 65%. For each, I will average the two scores. You must correct all problems, do extra problems and show me *before* you schedule a retake! Plan appropriately. You have until the second to last week before the final exams begin.
2. To determine your grade at any time, add all your points together (tests, quizzes, HW, etc.) and divide by the total. Grades will be *approximately* comprised of (plus or minus a few percent). If the points don't work out to fit close to these numbers, I will tell you how we will proceed.

Given the newness of doing everything online, everything is SUBJECT TO CHANGE, especially the approximate percentages.

Grading Scale:

The percents are rounded numbers.

Participation Grade – Online version

This grade is based upon how you manage yourself in class, i.e. being in class, being on time, doing your work in class, willingness to work in your group, bringing materials, paying attention, following directions, etc. Important! Active involvement in the class is critical. This part will reflect your active involvement in the class. If you do not participate, you do not earn the points. I will determine it at the end of the grading period.

Assignments

Homework will be assigned everyday and will be due the next class day. No late work accepted.

1. All work must be done in pencil. no pencil = no credit. This applies to *all* written work. *Corrections are to be done in pen color that clearly stands out.*
2. Put your name, date, period, HW # and the assignment including the page and problem numbers, in the *upper right corner* of the paper.
3. Show all your work--a list of answers is not acceptable.
4. Keep your assignments in your *binder* to use in studying for quizzes and tests. Some quizzes, called Binder Quizzes, will be directly from the assignments and notes, so keep your binder organized! You are required to be organized. I would suggest a binder (at least 1.5 inches) with all your math work in it. Fill it with graph paper. You will need it throughout the course.
5. *All graphs* are to be done on graph paper.

Grading

1. The purpose of the work is to learn. It takes practice. Assignments will make up a major part of the grade in online learning. Since the purpose of the work is practice, it will be graded on basis of: Did you give it an HONEST attempt on *all* problems? If you do not know how to do a problem attend office hours for help. *Attempt* all problems. Note that the process is an important aspect--not just the final answer--so, show your work!
2. The scan must be clear. That means the writing must be dark and readable, then scan it clearly.
2. A link will be provided for the solutions to almost all assignments. You are required to do the assignment and *correct all of it before* submitting it. I wrote the solutions showing all of the work. You need to show it as well. At that point, *your homework should be complete and correct*. Expect your assignments to be *graded*.
3. Homework is due at the beginning of class. If there is no hw check, it will be graded as:
 - 10 points = complete - all problems completed = done and corrected.
 - 8 points = most but not all of the problems completed (more than 80%)
 - 5 points = between half and three fourths of the problems completed
 - 0 points = half or less of the problems completed

Assessments

1. When doing an assessment, you will be expected to have your video and sound on. It will be recorded. An exception to this would be if the assessment is not done during a class like setting.
2. Do your own work. In brief, do not
 - communicate in any way with other students;
 - any other program during an assessment;
 - provide tips, questions, answers or any other information about assessments to peers before all students have had the opportunity to complete the assessment.

Cheating

Any form of cheating or dishonesty will not be tolerated. I encourage you to work together, however, copying will not be accepted. Any cheating (on exams, quizzes, HW, project...) will receive a minimum of a zero grade and disciplinary action by the school. *This includes copying one answer from the back of the book!* I will be honoring and adhering to the district Academic Honesty Policy.

Absences

1. It is *your* responsibility to find out what you missed and to make up the work – notes, quiz and test.
2. If you are absent N days, you will have N days to make up the missed work. If you know you will be absent, you need to be responsible and get the hw done on time.
3. Truancy/cut and unexcused absences will be handled in accordance with school policy; i.e. you will earn a *zero* on all work (HW, quiz, test, participation etc.) for the day.

No photography, video, or sound recording of any kind in the classroom, in any format, by any means.
